Summary judgment from court case. No decision on the next action to take has been made. No meeting since last general meeting. Residents are 76% against STVRs. City has not been responsive. The suit is not over, it is in the appeal window. Options are to continue legal action or get political. Some talk was brought up about funding to assist in the legal action. There was some discussion about the city's STVR committee run by staff, which is a separate committee and not affiliated with the PCC STVR committee which John Whitman is chair.

Time started | 7:37 | Topic Beach and Sand Committee Report Dan Scully |

History of Pierpont, residents used to hire tractors to push the sand back. In the early 1990's, the coastal commission said could not do this. City applied for a permit, which required a plan. The city did not wish to fund a plan. At one point the city owned all of Pierpont, they gave up portions to the state. The committee walked the entire Pierpont beach to take pictures and document the issues on the beach. Dan distributed a report including the pictures of the beach. This document is included in the minutes. No meetings with the organizations have occurred since the last general meeting. Dan plans to use this document in any forthcoming meetings.

Time started | 7:77 | Topic Cheryl Heitmann |



Any changes that are done have to consider the city charter. Some confusion as to recusal on the STVR issue. Districts go into effect in November 2018. Howard asked if the city will respond to the PCC letter. Cheryl mentioned the STVR committee and that other activity will happen and a recommendation be made. Only 8 STVR owners pulled themselves off the STVR list. The staff is going to make the recommendation on STVRs, not the committee. There was some concern about Gill Garcia running the committee as he is on staff. Staff is going to recommend an increase in planning staff to help with enforcement.



PCC BEACH COMMITTEE REPORT

Laura Kinney, Suzanne McCombs, and I surveyed the beach from the Crowne plaza to Marina Park. Our goal was to determine the extent of rock accumulation throughout the various segments of the beach... recognizing the rocks are a natural phenomenon. That said, our beach has been designated "recreational, "and, therefore, some type of grooming would be necessary to accommodate this use. There is none. In many portions of the Pierpont section of the beach the major part of the sand was fairly clear, but in many sections there is major rock accumulations are visually depicted throughout this report. Clearly none of our beach is groomed. Most groomed beaches have clear sand which is comfortable for walking. Our entire beach is quite uncomfortable in bare feet and walking it requires constant visual vigilance.

- 1. Greenock to Martha's Vineyard has essentially no cobble.
- 2. The pictures that follow depict the situation at the end of those lanes where cobble is in evidence.
- 3. San Pedro South to Sharon has good access to water with slight cobble (no pictures taken).
